COMMUNITY SURVEY

There are very few lunches being bought on a Monday currently (approx. 10-15). As a result, in Term 4, we will stop having regular Monday lunches cooked and sold but we will hold the occasional one during the term.

Children bring along food to be warmed up in a pie warmer in a suitable container/wrapper, with child's name and room number written on it. **2 min Noodles etc. are NOT suitable for this.**

This, like the Milos, are just held during the cold winter months.

WASTED FOOD

Recently the staff have noticed a significant amount of food being wasted at lunchtime, and it is often the wholesome, healthy food. Apples less than half eaten, bananas slightly brown from oxidation but not bruised, almost full yoghurt pots, segments of oranges and beautiful homemade sandwiches. As a result we have removed the rubbish bins from the eating area, are more carefully monitoring what children are eating and we are getting children to bring home all uneaten food and food wrapping.

Occasionally the size/amount of the food was too much for the child (i.e. some of the apples were massive). Smaller amounts and placed in smaller containers might also help.
