ROTO CROSS COUNTRY

The Cross country is held over on the Wallis Farm behind the Wallis Quarry, just across the road from school. Parents can park in the quarry itself and then walk up the driveway to the paddock on the left at the top of the hill. We require parents to watch the races from **inside** the paddock for two reasons:

1. So they don't accidentally get in the children's way as they are running,
2. So the rest of the children stay with the teachers in their House Groups to cheer for their team.

After all the races have finished we have our prizegiving, so again it is great if all the parents can stay put until the end so the winners receive the applause they deserve. Then parents are welcome to take their children home whilst the other children will return to school to catch buses etc.

This is a great opportunity for the tamariki to get dressed up in their house colours, put on some face paint and enjoy the day! If you aren't sure of your child's house colour please email the office.

The programme is very fluid if it is a miserably cold day but we do try to hold it anyway. Make sure your child is dressed for the weather, not just the race.

It is also a good day to pack a few extra snacks to have after their race, or before if they are running at the end of the day. They definitely need a drink bottle with them and **shoes are compulsory** so make sure they are wearing them as they walk out the front door in the morning.

BUS REMINDERS

If your child is getting picked up when they usually go on the bus please get the adult picking them up to come in to the office and tell someone. That 30 seconds of effort can fix 3-4 adults spending 15 minutes looking for missing children, a bus loads of children waiting to go and families wondering why the bus is so late.

Please don't ask the children to tell us about the change without you confirming it with us directly by text, phone, email.

We have believed children in the past but they had misunderstood the instruction and were left at school. So, as a rule, staff don't accept a child's explanation unless we have confirmation from an adult via phone/text/email or note.

LIBRARY HELP NEEDED

MEDICATION

It is a requirement of the school that no medication is given to a student without written consent, on the appropriate form. The medication sent to school must be in its original packaging with the name of the medication, the doage, the child's name and date issued. If there is no permission form is completed, parents are welcome to come to school at the appropriate time to administer the medication themselves.

SCHOOL SHIRT

If you would like a school t-shirt for your child, we have placed an order for some more so they should arrive soon. Whilst they are not compulsory, the children do look good as a group representing the school. They are \$35 from the office. We don't have eftpos, so it's cash or pay into the school account prior to pick up.

KNOWING WHAT IS HAPPENING

We communicate upcoming events as early as we can in a variety of formats. The 3 main ones are the **Facebook page, Skoolloop and Newsletter**. Whilst we don't always get it right, the vast majority of the time the information is out there. If you can't find it, ring Roxy – she doesn't just have her finger on the pulse, she has her whole hand on the pulse. If she has not been told, it takes her no time to find out for you.

The school uses a **private Facebook page** (*called Roto Parents*) which only parents/direct caregivers have access to (no aunties, uncles, family friends, grandparents, just those with day to day care of the students).

Skoolloop is an app that you download to your phone to receive messages, view the school calendar, send in absence messages, etc. Just download it from the App store and search for Roto-o-Rangi school.

The Newsletter is published every fortnight beginning in Week 1 of the Term (so week 1, 3, 5, 7, 9,11 of each term). It celebrates learning happening in the school and provides the latest information.

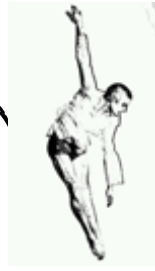
